I sincerely hope that you can go to the tennis court tonight with me. I love you very much.

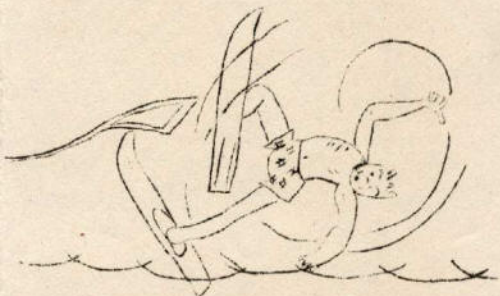
It was intercepted by the P.O.R.. In matters of correspondence, one really can't be too careful and cautious. Watch it there!
