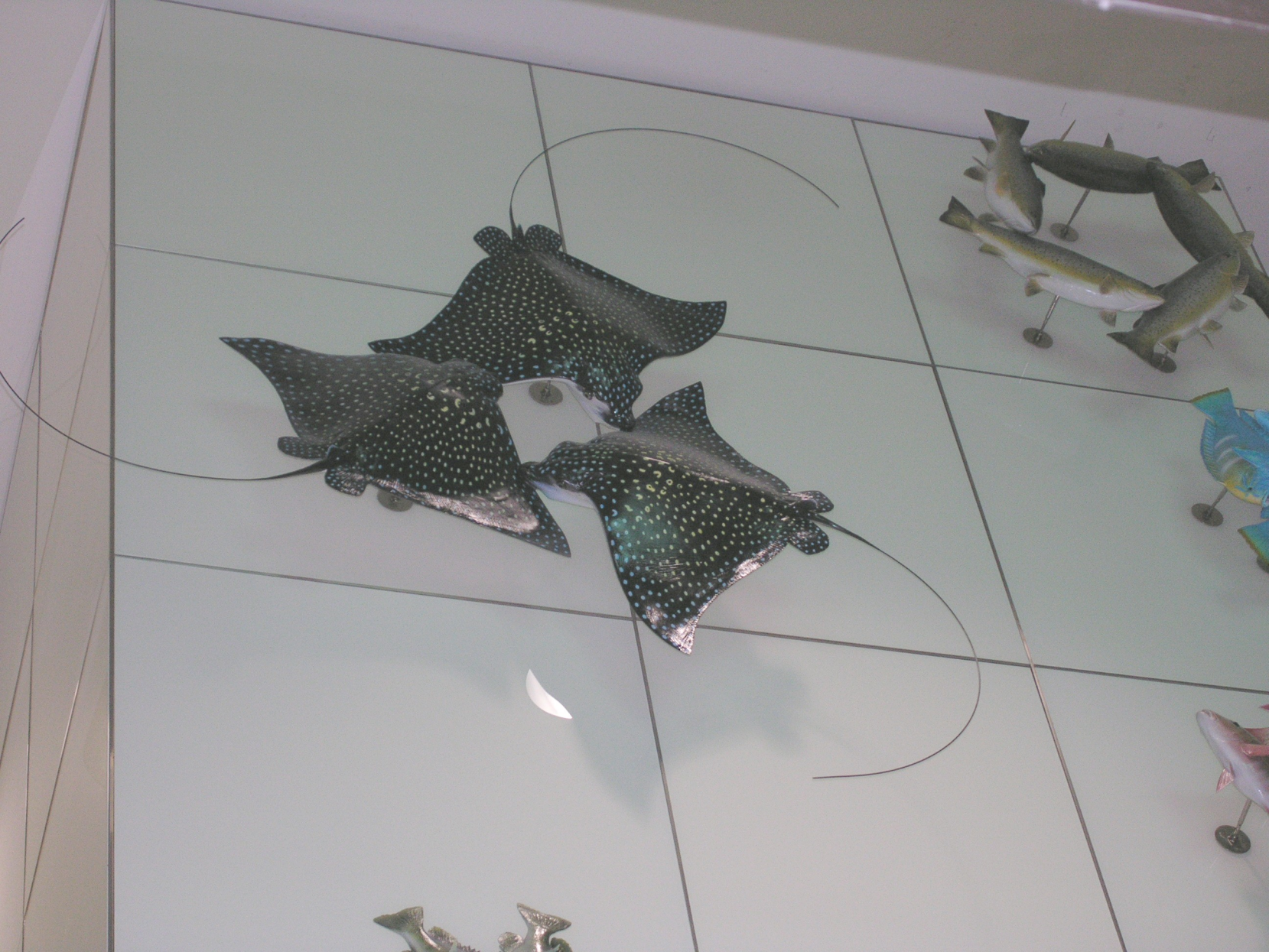

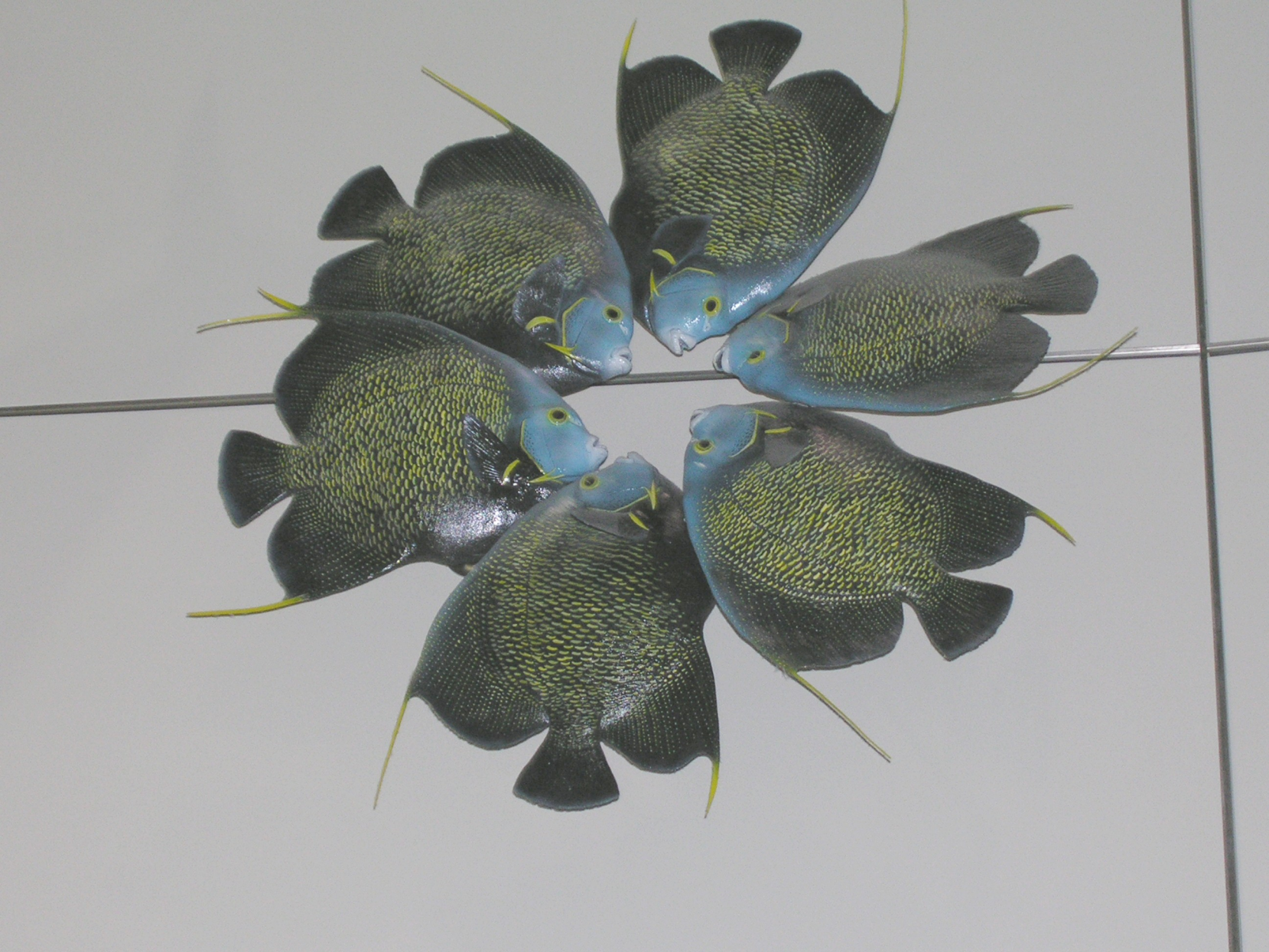

The original wind mill was built in Friesland (Holland) in 1804 for the purpose of pumping water from the lands that lay below sea level. After being damaged by a storm in 1878 it was disassembled and rebuilt elsewhere in Holland and used to mill grains, in 1929 it was again damaged by a storm

And no longer used.

In 1960 the remaining wooden structure was purchased by a Dutch merchant, brought to Aruba, in March 1961 and rebuilt atop a two-story concrete structure to be used as a Restaurant and Museum.
